*From the Pastor's Desk*

*“As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”*  
(John 20:21b)

This Sunday we celebrate Pentecost, when the Risen and Ascended Christ came to the Apostles and shared the Holy Spirit with them. The Church marks her beginning from this event, as the Apostles leave the Upper Room, imbued with the Holy Spirit, and proclaim the good news to the world.

Our Church is a Church of evangelization, of sharing with the world the good news of God's salvific love, through his Son, Jesus Christ.

As members of the Church, we are the Body of Christ in the world. Just as Christ, our Head, manifested the kingdom of God through his presence and his work, our aim, as his Body, is to make the kingdom of God present to others through our faithful relationship with Christ.

One of the ways the Church in the Archdiocese of Chicago is working to manifest the kingdom of God in the world is through the **Renew My Church** initiative. **The end goal of this Initiative is an increase in transformative evangelization.**

The hope of this initiative is to reinvigorate our relationship with Christ and to further impassion our efforts to draw others into a relationship with Christ. The more profound our relationship with Christ is, the more determined we become to share our good news with others.

The natural outcome of passionate evangelization, based on an authentic relationship with Christ, is conversion and transformation. This outcome, while always desirable, is even more important to our Church today.

As we know, we live in times when less people practice their faith, or even profess a faith to practice. Many people have become separated from the faith through secularism, scientism, and relativism, to name a few societal forces

The result of this separation is a diminishment of believers who are actively involved in the Church. This diminishment of practicing and believing Catholics has a direct impact on our parishes and their ability to effectively sustain their missions. The Church has less people coming to Mass, engaging in parish life, and responding to vocations.

The Archdiocese has close to 350 parishes. Based on priest retirement and ordination projections, there will be about 240 men eligible for the role of Pastor in the next fifteen years. Basic math tells us that in fifteen years, without a response to this situation, the Archdiocese will have 120 parishes without a Pastor to lead them.

In addition, there are more than a few parishes struggling to remain vital. That is, they do not have the human or material resources to sufficiently or effectively carry out their mission. The overall mission of a parish is spiritual nourishment and evangelization.

The Church wants parishes to be more than a location where Sacraments are celebrated. She wants our parishes to support, inspire, and lead people in discovering and deepening their relationship to Christ – an authentic relationship that reaches out into the world and draws others into a relationship with Christ, too.

Not surprisingly, the vitality of a parish is most clearly demonstrated through parishioner activity and participation in parish life. Indicators of parishioner involvement include attendance levels at Sunday Mass, ministerial programs and their level of parishioner involvement, and collection and contribution levels that satisfy operating and capital expenses.

Under the indicators for vitality that I have outlined above, **our parish fits the definition of a vital parish.** Our average Sunday Mass attendance of 1,014 exceeds the threshold of 1,000, which is considered strong; we have many active ministries with strong parishioner involvement; and our collections and contributions exceed our operational and capital needs (i.e., we have money in the bank).

Through the **Renew My Church** initiative, the Archdiocese is evaluating the vitality of her parishes. **As a first step, all of the parishes have been grouped with another parish or more. A grouping** is based on both the proximity of the parishes within the grouping and the perceived similarity between them as to type and culture.

In the case of St. Julian Eymard, **we have been grouped with Queen of the Rosary.** Although we don't have an elementary school like QR, we are located very near each other and we share a common neighborhood culture. We are seen as a suitable grouping for potential synergy among our parishes. That is, we have a high potential for increasing each other's vitality.

**During this initial stage, our parish is getting to know Queen of the Rosary.** To this end, we are looking for ways to do things together: sharing deacons and a DRE; combining outings to the Walk for Life and Seven Churches; celebrating Masses at each other's churches; combining our Lenten Mission; etc.

**The next stage, which all parishes will eventually go through in the next two or three years, is the Activation Phase.** During the Activation Phase, discussions about opportunities for enhancing our grouping's vitality will take place between our parishioners and QR's parishioners. Included in these discussions will be the Archdiocese, via **Renew My Church** representatives, as well as outside volunteer guides who are experienced and trained in facilitating in these discussions.

As you might expect, there are many different scenarios and possibilities as to the final outcomes of these discussions. They might range from relatively little change in the structure or operations of the different parishes in a grouping to significant change in the structure or operations of the different parishes, such as one or more of the parishes in a grouping being wholly adopted by another parish in the grouping.

As I mentioned, **our parish is vital, which means we are unlikely to experience significant change in our operations or structure after completing the Activation Phase.** Given the demonstrated vitality of the parishes in our grouping, it's likely that changes to our operations or structure might be limited to a combining of clergy and staff, with our parish and QR sharing a Pastor, an associate pastor, and an administrative staff; however, **since we have not yet gone through (or yet been scheduled for) the Activation Phase, the opportunities for re-directing and re-aligning our human and material resources with QR have not been discussed or determined.**

Unless we are wholly adopted by QR— a highly unlikely scenario given our vitality as a parish, **our parish assets remain with our parish and will not be transferred to QR.** Any assets transferred to QR or received from QR would be for services received or rendered (e.g., salaries for priests and/or staff in common).

In the end, the purpose of **Renew My Church** is an increase in transformative evangelization that will bridge the separation between us and our unbelieving or disengaged brothers and sisters, and encourage them to discover and to live the one, true faith.

We pray that the Holy Spirit guides our Church during this challenging time to increase our spiritual vitality and to attract both disengaged and new believers to Christ and his Church.





## Share with your Child the Joy of Giving



Parents can support their children's spiritual growth by giving them opportunities to put aside their own needs and give to others. Not only will it strengthen personal self esteem, kids will recognize the true joy of helping those in need. Have you tried these ways to share the joy of giving?

1. **Involve Your Kids in "Giving" Decisions.** - Explain to your children what portion of your family budget goes toward charity and helping others. Get them involved in deciding which causes to support.
2. **Make Giving to Others a "Given".** - Studies show that most generous adults had parents who also showed generosity, so be sure that helping others in need is something that your family simply does as a matter of course.
3. **Maintain a Balance Between Giving and Receiving.** - Make sure that your children see examples of giving and receiving within the family. Both sides are important for balanced personal development.
4. **Share Your Own Needs with Your Child.** - Depending on the age of the child, it's O.K. to occasionally say, "I need some help today. I would appreciate it if you took on some of my usual chores." Then be specific about what the child can do and how he or she can do it.
5. **Teach Them to "Offer it Up."** - The spiritual practice of "offering it up" is simply the exercise of offering one's difficulties and sufferings for the good of others. For example, your child might offer up their prayer on the stress of a major exam to someone who is sick or needs help. If they turn difficulties of the day into a prayer for others in need instead of themselves, it's a valuable lesson in giving, solidarity and love.
6. **Exercise Your Faith in God's Providence.** - Generosity is an attitude toward life. It presupposes the faith that God will provide and the conviction that as we have been given, so we should give.
