The Most Holy Trinity

MAY 27, 2018



The Lord is God in the heavens above
and on earth below; there is no other.

Deuteronomy 4:39

From the Pastor's Desk

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” (Matthew 28:19-20a)

This Sunday we celebrate the **Most Holy Trinity**, the mystery of One God in three separate persons. As the quote above makes clear, Jesus directs our baptism - our entry, into God's family in the name of these three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Each person of the Trinity is essential to our spiritual lives and to our participation in God's family.

Jesus' incarnate divinity is indispensable to our salvation, to our ability to achieve communion with God the Father as well as with God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' divinity makes his Paschal sacrifice a once-for-all sacrifice that pleases his Father forever and acts to redeem humanity from sin and death. Jesus' humanity enables us to share in Christ's glory. Jesus Christ is both the gate and the bridge to eternal life with God. The Holy Spirit is Jesus' gift to us and he guides and protects us, as we strive to follow Jesus in this life.

In last week's bulletin I wrote about the significance of parish vitality in the Archdiocese's evaluation of parishes, as part of the **Renew My Church** initiative. At that time, I pointed out the importance of financial stability as a key indicator of parish vitality.

Parishes that consistently pay their financial obligations and maintain their facilities, while setting aside money for future projects, demonstrate one of the critical traits of vitality. As I mentioned last week, our Parish demonstrates this trait of vitality - we pay our obligations, maintain our facilities, and place money into savings for future projects.

That being said, our Parish, while routinely collecting enough money to remain financially stable, does not routinely collect the \$10k each week that has been budgeted to assure our Parish of having a sufficient amount of money for unexpectedly large projects that might suddenly arise or to currently pay for large projects such as a new parking lot or increased church and meeting space.

Sometimes the weekly or monthly collection is not as high as it might be because parishioners cannot attend Mass or because they overlook their regular contribution. In an attempt to avoid this situation and to better standardize collection amounts, **the Parish is offering on-line giving to parishioners.** All parishioners are encouraged to take advantage of this service.

On-line giving is a means for parishioners to set up regular contributions from their bank to the parish, just as they would do with on-line bill payments. As such, parishioners with on-line giving would not have to write checks or bring (or mail) their checks to the parish every week or month. Once they set up their account with the parish, their contributions would be automatically sent to the parish on a regular basis.

Since this is an automated process, the risk to the Parish of errors in counting contributions or in recording them diminishes. From the parishioners' standpoint, the concern for checks being properly recorded or clearing in a timely manner is eliminated. They know in advance how much their contribution is and when it will be sent.

Again, **all parishioners are encouraged to take advantage of the on-line giving process.** To begin the process, please go to our website at www.StJulianEymard.org. Find the **“Our Parish”** section (the title of the last of the four green boxes in the middle of the page - following the boxes entitled “PPC,” “Our Faith,” and “Parish Events”) and locate **“Parish On-Line Giving.”** at the bottom of the list for this box or section. Click on this last option to be connected to the on-line giving page.

As you probably know, **we are celebrating our 50th Anniversary this year.** As part of this celebration, we are preparing a *St. Julian Eymard 50th Anniversary Parish Directory* to contain the family portraits of all parishioners who choose to have their pictures taken. The directory will also contain a parish history, current and historical photos of St. Julian parish life, and a roster of parishioners in our parish.

A copy of the finished *St. Julian Eymard 50th Anniversary Parish Directory* will be free to all parish families who sit for a portrait. This includes individual parishioners who might live on their own and who sit individually for a portrait. Parishioners who sit for a portrait will also be allowed to access a website where a digital copy of the directory will be stored.

The more parish families who sit for a portrait, the more valuable the directory will be to users and the more likely it is that we will qualify for hardcover editions of the directory, for everyone. From my experience at St. Germaine Parish, her Parish Directory was **a useful and convenient way to put names to faces and to discover parishioners who might have been previously unfamiliar** to me. A Parish Directory is an enjoyable and easy way to foster community.

Since a greater level of involvement increases our eligibility for hardcover editions of the directory, **even non-parishioners are encouraged to sit for a portrait**. While their portraits will not be included in the directory, they will have the opportunity to sit for a professional quality portrait of their family.

All parish and non-parish families who sit for a portrait will have the opportunity to purchase individual copies of these portraits for their personal use, from Lifetouch, the company that manages the preparation and publishing of the directory. After a parish family's picture has been taken, **the family may view the results immediately** on a digital monitor. If a family is unhappy with the pictures, it may have new pictures taken right away, without setting up another appointment.

Photographers will be on site at our parish as early as Monday and Tuesday, July 2nd and 3rd to take portraits of parish families. Parish families may schedule a time with the Parish to have their portrait taken by Lifetouch's professional photographer. **Please contact the Parish Office, go to the Parish website, or check our bulletin for more information about scheduling a time to have your family's portrait taken.**

For those parish families who are unable to sit for a portrait, they can submit a family portrait for inclusion in the directory, for a \$15 fee. Parish families who submit their own photo will be eligible for a Parish Directory at no further charge.

As a preliminary kick-off to our 50th Anniversary celebration, **Cardinal Blase Cupich has agreed to celebrate a Mass at our church** on the Sunday following the Memorial Day of St. Peter Julian Eymard (August 2nd). **The Mass will be at 11am on Sunday, August 5th.** There will be a light reception in Shea Hall following the Mass. Owing to the noise and traffic that would likely accompany this reception, there will be no 12:30pm Mass on this day, Sunday, August 5th.

As a further part of our kick-off celebration, **a limited-seating dinner is being planned at a reception hall outside the parish**. While plans have yet to be finalized, tickets for this dinner will be on sale to parishioners in advance of the event. These ticket sales will be on a first come basis. More information will be provided, as plans become more definite.

Following on these preliminary kick-off events, **the Parish will celebrate her fifty years of community at the 50th Anniversary Family Festival on September 16th**, to be held on our Parish grounds. The event will begin after the 12:30pm Mass and go until 7pm. **The event will be free to all parishioners and guests** and will include activities for the entire family.

As a means to defray costs and to add excitement to our **50th Anniversary Family Festival, we are seeking raffle and game prizes as well as auction items for this event**. If you have professional sports tickets, airline miles, hotel points, a vacation home to lend for a weekend, or other valuable or interesting items to donate, please contact the Parish Office during the week from 8:30am to 4pm.

We need your help to make our anniversary celebration a success. Unless otherwise requested, names of parishioners donating items or cash in excess of \$99 to the **50th Anniversary Family Festival** will be published together in the bulletin under the heading "**St. Julian Eymard Angels.**"
