*From the Pastor's Desk*

*"If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand."*

(Mark 3:24)

As we enter the Tenth Week of Ordinary time, we are reminded of the importance of unity. When we work together as a community, supporting and nourishing each other in the pursuit of the good, we preserve and foster the good that we seek.

This idea, of course, applies to our parish. Our overriding goal as parishioners is to cultivate the faith, hope, and love that we all find in and through Christ. In cultivating our faith, hope, and love in and through Christ, we build our community and support each other in attaining that greatest happiness and purpose, eternal life in God's community.

The unity we foster is grounded in the Church, the sacrament of Christ in the world. By adhering to Church teaching and partaking of the Sacraments, we build the kingdom of God. We seek to support each other in following Church teaching and in praising God through worship.

While there are many ways to build community in the parish, participation through the use of our particular gifts and blessings to promote worship and parish life is fundamental.

The Church provides five precepts for every Catholic:

1. Attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
2. Confess your sins at least once a year.
3. Receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
4. Observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
5. Help to provide for the needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.

These precepts describe the minimum spiritual requirements for every Catholic. Of course, it is hoped that each of us would do more than the minimum.

Ways of doing more than the minimum are plentiful. They might include participating in the Mass as a **lector**, **an extraordinary minister of communion**, **an usher**, or **a choir member**. Our parish is in need of each of these ministries. As you might know, we are currently distributing only two cups of the Precious Blood at Mass because we do not have enough ministers to do more.

Another way to do more might be to serve as a **catechist** (i.e., a religious education instructor), **a minister of care**, or **a bereavement minister**. A parishioner might join one of our many groups, committees, or councils. For example, the **Catholic Council of Women**, **the Youth Group**, **the Good Samaritans**, **Bible Study**, **the Shawl Ministry**, **Rosary Group**, etc. A parishioner might volunteer to help at events such as the **annual Parish Picnic**, **the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Family Festival**, etc. Parishioners might also take part in parish events such as the **Parish Lenten Mission**, **Bunco**, **Canasta**, **Pancake Breakfast**, **Parish Picnic**, etc.

With this being our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year, there will be plenty of opportunities for parishioners to participate more fully in parish life through committee work, volunteer work, event attendance, and donations of silent auction items or prizes.

Simply having a family portrait taken for the **50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Parish Directory** helps to build our parish community.

Please consider one of the numerous ways I have suggested to become involved in the parish and promote unity within our community.

Information on the many events, ministries, and activities throughout the parish are usually in our Mass Announcements, Parish Bulletin, or Parish Website ([www.stjulianeynard.org](http://www.stjulianeynard.org)).

**I encourage each of our parishioners to consider getting involved in the parish beyond Sunday Mass attendance.** (If you only come to the Parish for Sunday Mass, please consider becoming an usher, lector, or extraordinary minister of care for your Mass time. We can use your help!)

Even signing up for **On-Line Giving** helps to build our parish by ensuring that your contributions arrive in a timely and certain manner, especially when you might be away from home for the weekend.

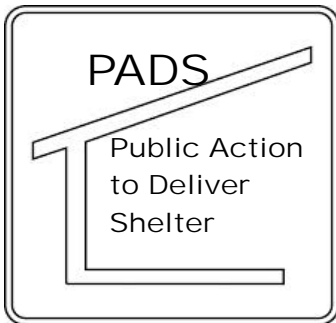

## **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a “big church,” as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a *cathedra* (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop.

There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that “the seat is vacant,” and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the *cathedra*. No one but the bishop sits in the *cathedra* during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the *cathedra* in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when a visitor tries the *cathedra* out for the bishop’s point of view.

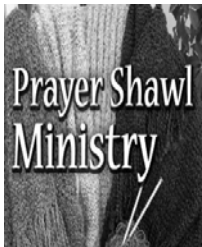
