From the Pastor's Desk

“Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: ‘This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.’” (Mark 1:14b-15)

This weekend is the first Sunday of Lent, which began last week on Ash Wednesday.

Our parish theme for Lent is, “**The kingdom of God is at hand.**” This quotation is from the Church’s reading for this Sunday’s gospel.

With the arrival of Jesus Christ, the kingdom of God physically entered our material world. Through Christ’s death and resurrection, and through his gifts of the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist, the kingdom of God has been revealed and thrown open for all who believe and follow Christ. The kingdom of God is at hand for all who choose to accept Christ’s invitation of life.

Let us use this time of Lent to cultivate our friendship with the Lord through the spiritual exercises of fasting, abstinence, prayer, and service to others. While these exercises are important to engage in regularly, Lent is a time to give them particular attention, as we recall our desire to grow ever closer to the Lord and follow his journey to the cross.

The exercise of fasting applies to those from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. We are expected to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The exercise of abstaining from meat, on the Fridays during Lent, applies to those who are age 14 or older.

Catholics are encouraged, but not required, to give up some nonessential and enjoyable food or activity during Lent. As Sunday is a day of celebration and rest, one might exempt oneself from his/her pledge on this day without betraying his/her Lenten pledge. In addition, Catholics are encouraged to take on an additional service or activity that benefits someone in need or enhances their spiritual life, such as daily Mass or devotions such as the rosary or stations of the cross, or contributing time or money to the needy.

Throughout all of these exercises and activities, we are to remain joyful for the opportunity to offer God our effort and suffering, and to remember that our suffering is a means toward a closer relationship with God. We are not trying to lose weight or impress people by our sacrifices. We are trying to deepen our love and appreciation for God and the many gifts he offers to us, especially that of his presence in eternal life.

The kingdom of God is at hand for each us. Let us embrace this gift and nourish its presence in all that we do.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Holy Father usually marks the solemn opening of the Lenten fast with a procession and Mass on Ash Wednesday evening. He walks from the Benedictine monastery, San Anselmo, down the Aventine hill to the Dominican monastery of Santa Sabina. This very old tradition was revived by Pope John XXIII in the late 1950s. Have you ever wondered who gives the pope his ashes? It's the cardinal who has been given the "title" of the church of Santa Sabina. The pope's homily at this Mass states his theme for Lent.

Santa Sabina dates from the fifth century, and is one of the most beautiful churches in Rome. One of the panels on its main doors features the Crucifixion, a scene not normally depicted in art until much later. In the year 1219 the pope gave the church to Saint Dominic for his new religious order, the "Order of Preachers," commonly called the Dominicans, and it remains their world headquarters to this day. That pope, Honorius III, was a member of the Savelli family, and this church was their personal family chapel. Sabina was a wealthy Roman lady who became a Christian and was martyred, and whose home became a place of prayer. Later, the church built on that spot was dedicated to her memory.
