THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS AT HAND

**Third Sunday of Lent
March 4, 2018**

I, the LORD, am your God . . .
You shall not have other gods besides me.
— Exodus 20:2a, 3

From the Pastor's Desk

“And he told those who sold the pigeons, ‘Take these things away; you shall not make my Father’s house a house of trade.’

“His disciples remembered that it was written, ‘Zeal for your house will consume me.’”
(John 2:16-17)

As Jesus nears the hour of his passion, he displays his zealous love for his Father by chastising the vendors and money-changers who are desecrating the Temple through their avarice and their distractive behavior.

At the same time, Jesus refers to his divine Son-ship by calling the Temple “my Father’s house.” Jesus is clearly aware of his identity as the Word incarnate. He is also aware of his upcoming passion and death at the hands of his persecutors. In fact, his conspicuous zeal for his Father’s house reminds the Apostles of the words at Psalm 68:9a, “Zeal for your house has consumed me.” This Psalm itself is a prayer for deliverance from persecution.

A powerful and befitting line from this Psalm asks, “What I did not steal, must I now restore?” As we know, Jesus, who was without sin, took on our sins to redeem us from sin and death. What he did not steal, he restored.

It is only through Jesus’ unwavering fealty and love – his *zeal*, for his Father, that we are able to participate in Christ’s gift of eternal salvation. During Lent, we work to increase and demonstrate our zeal for Christ by clearing away the distractive attachments in our lives and converting ourselves ever more closely to Christ’s life.

Our parish will be offering a **Reconciliation Service on Tuesday, March 13th**, following our Lenten Mission presentation. There will be an opportunity for individual confession with a priest at that time.

The theme for our parish’s **Lenten Mission** is, “**The Passion of Our Lord According to the Gospel of Mark.**” **Rev. James McIlhone** is presenting our mission this year. Fr. McIlhone is also preaching at

each Mass next weekend. **The Mission is on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday evenings on March 12th, 13th, and 14th, respectively, beginning at 7pm each day.** There will be a light reception in Shea Hall following the Mission on Wednesday, March 14th. Please join us!

To encourage our daily Mass attenders to come to our Lenten Mission Mass, there will be **no morning Mass on Wednesday, March 14th.**

For those who cannot make our parish Reconciliation Service, please refer to the bulletin and web site for information on other local Reconciliation Services during Lent as well as times for individual confessions at our parish and at other parish churches in the area.

As a reminder, there will be **no morning Masses on Holy Thursday or Good Friday.**

We will celebrate the *Triduum* of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday at 7pm, on March 29th, 30th, and 31st, respectively. Please plan to join us.

In memoriam of our beloved **Deacon Jack Nolan**, the **Gard family** has donated an altar cloth to our Parish. The altar cloth, embroidered with Deacon Jack’s name, has been blessed and rests on the altar – a place from where Deacon Jack worshipped during Mass, from where he made his way home, and from where he and all the faithful join us with, in, and through Christ.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

If your parish is reading from Year B of the Lectionary today, and not Year A, as is normally done when there are elect present for the scrutinies and preparing for Easter baptism, you hear about Jesus driving the money-changers from the temple. If you wished to get as close as possible to this site today, you would in fact be at a Muslim shrine, the Dome of the Rock, built on the ruins of Herod's temple.

Archeologists believe that this striking, gold-domed crown of a shrine is set precisely where the Holy of Holies once was. Jews believe that the rock is the exact spot where Abraham was prepared to sacrifice Isaac. It is not a mosque, as some think, but a shrine, the oldest one in the Muslim world. For them, the rock is the place from which the Prophet Mohammed ascended on a visit to heaven. The Crusaders mistook the shrine for the actual Temple of Solomon, and the infamous Knights Templar used it as their headquarters and model for their churches elsewhere. The geometric perfection of the shrine is a mathematician's dream. The inscriptions are not exactly hospitable though, since they encourage Christians to "depart from error" and declare that "Jesus son of Mary was only a messenger of God." In ancient times, those who prayed here after walking around the rock were given a certificate entitling the bearer to admission to paradise. The ticket had to be buried with them.

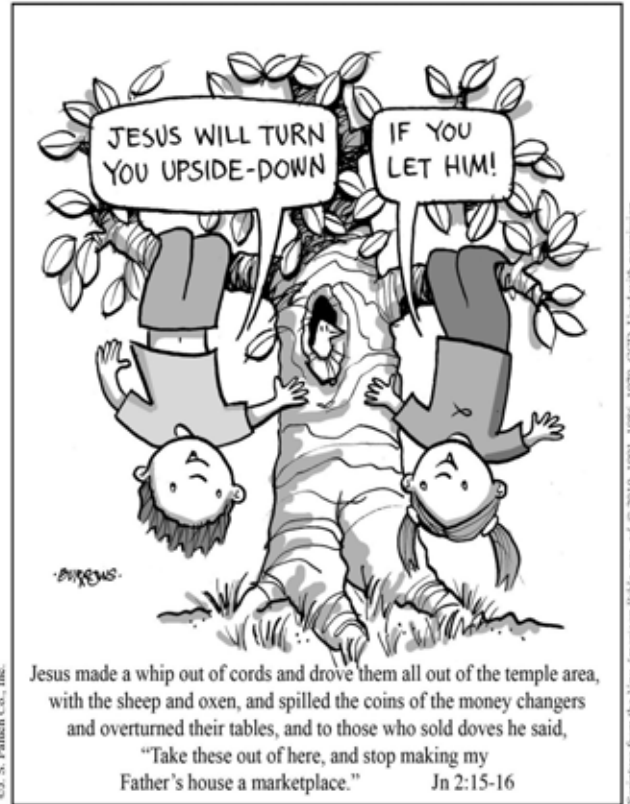

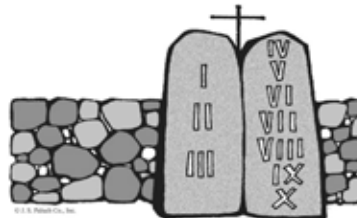

KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH



There's no better way to deepen our Lenten practice than to review the

Ten Commandments. The first three, having to do with our right relationship to God, get the most ink. The one we busy people probably have the most problem with is keeping holy the Sabbath.

If we take this commandment literally, babies will go undiapered and dishes will stay on the table, or perhaps meals will not be served. The sick will go unattended and nothing that has anything to do with physical labor will be done. Is mental labor really work? How about changing that dirty diaper (poor baby!)?

We need to depend on God to discern how to observe real Sabbath time in our lives. The point of this commandment is that God has given us a great gift: one whole day per week when we are free to rest, worship God, sing, feast, love, and rejoice. As Psalm 19 proclaims: "The law of the LORD is perfect, / refreshing the soul" (19:8). Our Sabbath rest is a great gift, to be received from God with joy, not with nitpicking.
